Purpose of the position

Responsible for seeking grants and raising support from foundations, corporations, and government sources requiring proposals for both unrestricted operating revenue and restricted projects.

Key Responsibilities

- Research and identify grants for which School for Life Foundation is applicable.
- Produce extensive institutional donor profiles; target appropriate ask amounts; and prioritise and evaluate prospects for corporate, foundation and government grants.
- Prioritise timing and manage the preparation and submission of grants proposals.
- Work with Founding Directors to write all proposals, budgets, reports and other ancillary materials.
- Manage existing grants by: tracking grants; developing internal reporting systems; writing reports; maintaining excellent historical records; working with Directors and staff to ensure each project or program is meeting proposal conditions and expectations.
- Monitor and manage grants income goal.
